





Community health centers serve as the backbone to Medi-Cal's primary care delivery system. This measure will direct funding to help clinics increase activities around quality improvement and access to specialists.

Community Health Centers will be able to offer increased appointment availability, have improved data quality and reporting and can further enhance their care coordination with other Medi-Cal providers.

The Coalition to Protect Access to Care, a group of doctors, healthcare workers, community health centers, Planned Parenthood, health plans and emergency responders, is supporting a ballot measure to permanently dedicate funding to help hospitals, clinics and doctors' offices stay open.

Without increasing cost on individual health premiums, the measure will bring more federal funds back to California and improve access to critical healthcare services.

Specifically, the initiative would:

+ Provide funds to keep hospitals and doctors' offices open, and expand access to healthcare – without raising taxes.





+ Provide more funding for primary and specialty care, mental health, expanded emergency room access, affordable prescription drugs, family planning, dental care, and to hire more healthcare workers.



+ Ensure that healthcare dollars are actually spent on patient care, requiring 99% of the money raised to go to patient care while ensuring administrative expenses are limited to 1%.





+ Expand our state's education and training to create a pipeline of healthcare workers and providers, including nurses, physician assistants, dentists and medical assistants.
